



Executive master in European journalism

Terms and conditions

Agreement to this document is essential to validate your application.

1. The executive master in European Journalism is a daytime and full-time (lessons, workshops and practical assignments) study programme.
2. Upon successful notification of their application, applicants have 15 working days to pay the deposit, 1,000€. Only when the deposit is received will applicants be officially integrated in the programme.
3. Under no circumstances will the deposit be refunded.
4. Once the deposit is paid, students are officially registered and liable to pay the rest of the total registration fee, 1,950€, by the academic start of the programme (mid-September).
5. For applications received less than 15 days prior to the academic start of the programme, the full fee has to be paid at once.
6. Attendance is required throughout the year. Students working part-time are required to make arrangements to ensure they can attend classes.
7. The teaching is in English; some occasional extra-curricular sessions in French may be organized. During those sessions, student can interact in English.
8. The executive master in European journalism has a cosmopolitan staff and student body, drawing its students from around Europe. Cultural exchange is thus a key element in the master.
9. Most of the lessons take place in the morning; sometimes they take place across a full day, and occasionally in the evening or on Saturdays. There are around 14 hours of teaching a week, and 14 hours of practical assignments that the students can organize throughout the week as they choose.
10. Internship is optional; students are responsible for finding a host media outlet if they decide to do one. The school will provide them only with some contacts.
11. We make sure that students are in contact with stakeholders and professionals from the field. However, the programme does not include any job placement; it is up to the students, throughout the master, to expand their professional opportunities through contacts we provide and that they make themselves.



12. Students are responsible for any media equipment provided by the school that they use. They are held responsible for any loss or thefts (only under certain circumstances will the insurance cover theft).
